

# Terms and Conditions

## ISPNO/SNO Pediatric Low-Grade Glioma Research Fellowship

By submitting an application for the ISPNO/SNO Pediatric Low-Grade Glioma Research Fellowship, applicants agree to comply with the terms and conditions provided below.

### **Eligibility Criteria**

Applicants must be postdoctoral fellows, clinical fellows, or junior faculty members engaged in research relevant to pediatric low-grade glioma (pLGG).

Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to advancing the field of Pediatric Neuro-Oncology through their proposed research project.

### **Application for Research Proposal**

All applications must include a detailed research proposal that aligns with the objectives of the fellowship.

Proposals should clearly outline the research's significance, proposed methodologies, expected outcomes, and relevance to pLGG.

The deadline for application is October 14, 2024.

### **Grant Funding**

The fellowship will provide a grant of \$75,000 in each calendar year inclusive of indirect costs.

The grant funds are specifically designated for the Pediatric Low-Grade Glioma Research Fellowship and must be used for research-related expenses outlined in the approved budget.

### **Acknowledgment of Funding Source**

The fellowship recipients must acknowledge Day One Biopharmaceuticals as the funder in all promotional and collateral materials developed in association with the award.

### **Administration**

The Society for Neuro-Oncology (SNO) will administer the fellowship, including the submission and review process and the distribution of funds to the selected awardee.

### **Selection Process**

Fellowship applications will be evaluated by an impartial joint awards committee comprising ISPNO and SNO leadership representatives.

The committee will select the award recipient(s) based on the merit of the proposed research and the applicant's qualifications.

**Term**

1-year term

**Reporting Requirements**

The fellowship recipients must provide the awards committee with regular progress reports detailing the status of their research project and the use of grant funds. Recipients may be invited to present findings of their research at an ISPNO or SNO conference.

**Disbursement of Funds**

Grant funds will be disbursed to the selected awardee(s) in accordance with the approved budget and upon completion of any necessary administrative requirements.

**Ethical Standards**

The fellowship recipients must conduct their research in accordance with the highest ethical standards and adhere to all relevant institutional guidelines and regulations.

**Compliance**

Applicants and awardees are responsible for complying with all terms and conditions outlined in this agreement.

**Other considerations**

Applicants must be members of the Society for Neuro-Oncology. The society offers a range of membership categories at different price points for all professionals working in the field.
